
### Tips and Suggestions for Career Selection

Choosing a career after the 10th or 12th board examination is very crucial decision in a student's life. This choice not only determines the direction of their future education but can also influence many aspects of their personal and professional life. Yet, for many students, this process is filled with uncertainty and confusion. This article examines these challenges and also provides some options for career selection.

**Some common influencing factors on Career selection are as follows –**

1. Parental Expectations or Pressure is the most common influencing factor. As children are not exposed to various streams and career options under it, there is a tendency to accept the decision of parents. Though it can be appropriate also for few, it become extremely compulsive for few others.
2. Peer Influence is yet another common influencing factors. Friends who have been with the students over 10 years are bound to influence each other's career choices.
3. Role Models and Fascinations – In some cases students get influenced by different personalities viz. closed relatives, parents of their friends, online influencers, personalities promoting a particular stream etc and based on such personalities students select the similar career as pursued by such role models.
4. Social Status also impacts career choice.
5. Other Factors like advertisements, motivational lectures, results of aptitude tests and indicative career paths suggested by counselors etc.

Influencing factors as stated above work out best for some students while it adds to confusion for many others.

**Myths and Misconceptions in Career Choices** - Students often make decisions based on beliefs that may not reflect reality –

Myths	Effect
Selection of Science Stream as the Default Choice - Many opt for science stream thinking they can shift to commerce or Arts stream later if needed or The assumption that science stream students earn more or gain more respect.	In reality many students end up with postponing the actual career selection decision to 2 or 3 more years wasting time, money and energy. In few cases they get drag down unnecessarily.
Selection of Commerce Stream by elimination method.	Some students choose commerce stream not by interest, but because science stream is difficult and Arts stream is considered impractical. So decision is not by selection method but by elimination method.
Misconceptions about Arts Stream	Stereotypes label arts as a "cheap" stream meant only for girls, or as having fewer financial opportunities.



### Practical Tips for Making the Right Career Choice:

Instead of being swayed by myths or social pressures, here are some grounded strategies for choosing your career path:

#### 1. Explore and Discuss

Talk with your family, teachers, seniors, and professionals. Ask questions and seek perspectives.

Make sure you understand -

- The timeline and cost of education
- The skills and efforts needed
- The employment or business opportunities in that field after you complete your graduation or post-graduation
- The alignment of the career with your personality and interests

#### 2. Start with the End in Mind

Visualize your dream career and then work backward. For instance -

- Want to be an IT expert? Science may be a suitable stream.
- Want to become a lawyer? Commerce could be the right path.

Also ensure to talk with sufficient working professionals and understand their suggestions in this regard.

#### 3. Revisit Your Interests –

Go back to your 10th-grade textbooks and identify -

- Subjects and topics you truly enjoyed
- The reasons behind this interest—was it the topic or just a great teacher?
- Possible career options linked to those interests

Use the internet, career counselors, and conversations with professionals to explore these ideas further.

#### 4. Changing Streams is OK

It's important to remember that changing your stream or career direction later, even after 12th or graduation is not a failure at all. It's a sign of growth and self-awareness. Many modern job roles require a blend of skills from different disciplines, and flexibility is an asset. The New Education Policy (NEP) recognizes this and encourages multidisciplinary learning.





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During this transition, value-added courses and short-term certifications can bridge the gap and open up new opportunities.

### 5. What Not to Do

- Don't follow friends blindly. Career is not a group activity like watching a movie.
- Don't accept or reject options just because your family suggested them.
- Don't get swayed by the glamour of celebrity success stories. Instead, learn from their journeys.

### 6. Note some interesting facts to be noted

Did you know? A degree alone may not get you a good job—or help you sustain one. And it certainly won't guarantee success as an entrepreneur.

In today's world -

- Skills are more important than just qualifications
- The ability to learn, unlearn, and relearn is crucial
- Soft skills (like communication, leadership, and adaptability) are highly valued and have become must to rise in your career
- Networking, referrals, and personal goodwill can open more doors than you expect

At the heart of, entire career selection activity lies the “Self-awareness”. So, take the time to reflect, research, discuss and choose your path wisely. But do not forget that “No effort ever goes waste.”

## *Thought for the Month* *The Gen Z world... - Viivek A Pandey*

Dear Students of DSPPL and my young friends,

The previous generation, which sounds ancient now, used to say, “check, check, mike check”. This generation Z, they say, “Vibe check”. Truth for them is neither black nor white, their truth is only the vibe they get. The Gen Z arrived at a time when both the world and nature were going through chaos. The climate had started to misbehave, and the world now knew the word broke. Gen Z is born with the glow of the Wi-fi. Their dreams are conceived on screens with memes. Trending was a word used only for fashion; these days the Gen Z uses the word for thought and activism. Back in the old days, a mistake was a mistake; these days, to use a faulty language is the new norm. Back in the old days, traveling abroad was a big deal, but these Gen Z kids are born globalized citizens. Be it Korean dramas or Lago’s beat, Gen Z has brought a flavor of the world to their minds.

The changes are there for most people to notice. However, some are particularly a cause of concern. Imagine a generation surviving with fewer resources and displaying the highest level of patience in every aspect of life. Be it receiving replies through mail after months of writing to their loved ones, or surviving without electricity. The human connection with the previous culture-driven generation sets a very high example of community living. The Gen Z, despite hyper-connectivity, faces a growing issue of loneliness. The Gen Z is vocal about mental health, but they face high rates of anxiety, depression, and burnout. Social media amplifies comparison and pressure, with 24/7 connectivity making it hard to disconnect. Constant exposure to curated online personas creates pressure to perform and conform. Issues like body image, cyberbullying, and FOMO are rampant. Gen Z’s fluency in digital spaces is a strength, but it also leaves them vulnerable to misinformation and polarized echo chambers.

The traditional path of degree-to-job is less reliable for Gen Z. Many question the value of college due to debt and shifting jobmarkets. Automation and AI threaten entry-level roles, pushing Gen Z toward entrepreneurial ventures or reskilling, which demands adaptability.

Gen Z is socially aware, advocating for inclusivity and justice, but they navigate a fractured cultural landscape. Cancel culture and ideological divides make open dialogue tricky, and many feel caught between speaking out and avoiding backlash. Gen Z believes “it’s okay to not be okay” and sees less stigma in seeking help than older cohorts do. Gen Z opened the floodgates and made it acceptable to talk openly about mental health at work, with their friends, and on social media. Changes like these might seem jarring now, but they will soon be commonplace, as the industry increasingly caters to the preferences of Gen Z. Young people won’t be the only beneficiaries; however, older generations will appreciate many of these improvements too.

This draws on Gen Z’s digital fluency, activism, and globalized identity, shaped by platforms like X and TikTok. Gen Z navigates a world of paradoxes: hyper-connected yet isolated, activist yet skeptical, innovative yet anxious. The Gen Z, fortunately or unfortunately, is riding the big wave of change that none is capable of coping with.

## The Three little Pigs

Did you know that some stories can teach us about money? Continuing with our series on financial literacy for children, we bring you another article that gives a financial twist to a classic bedtime story. We aim to introduce financial concepts to children through simple language and practical examples. We hope you enjoy reading this section.

**The original story: “The Three Little Pigs”**

Three little pigs set off to build their own homes. In the classic tale, each pig chooses a different material to build their house. The first two pigs want to play, so they build quickly with weak materials. The first pig built a straw house—quick and easy! The second used sticks—better, but still wobbly. The third pig worked hard and built a strong brick house. Then came the Big Bad Wolf! He huffed and puffed and blew down the straw and stick houses. But the brick house stood strong! The wolf couldn't get in, and the third pig was safe and cozy. The other pigs learned that doing things the right way—even if it takes more time and effort—keeps you safe in the long run.

**What We Can Learn About Money from the Three Little Pigs**

**🧱 Build Smart Like the Brick Pig**

The first two pigs built their houses quickly so they could play, but their homes were weak. The third pig took more time and effort to build a strong house that lasted.

- **Buy things that last:** Instead of buying a toy that breaks in a day, save up for one that's strong and fun for a long time. For example, a good backpack might cost more, but it won't tear easily like a cheaper one.
- **Think before you spend:** Before buying something, ask:
  - Do I really need this?
  - Will I still like it next week?
  - Can I wait and save for something better?
  - Don't rush just because others are: Sometimes friends may buy things quickly, but it's okay to take your time and make a smart choice—just like the third pig!

Try This!

- Ask your child to pick one toy they want to save for.
- Help them draw three jars or boxes: Spend, Save, Share.
- Let them decorate their own “brick house” piggy bank.

### Save for Rainy Days Like a Clever Pig

The third pig didn't wait for the wolf to come—he was ready! That's what smart savers do too.

- Save a little every week: Even if you get just a small amount of pocket money, try to save a part of it. You can use a piggy bank, a jar, or even a small envelope. Over time, your savings will grow!
- Make a mini-budget: Divide your money into three parts: i) Spend – for small treats or toys; ii) Save – for something big or important later; iii) Share – maybe give a little to someone in need or a cause you care about
- Be ready for surprises: Just like the wolf came without warning, sometimes we need money for things we didn't expect—like a broken toy or a school trip. Saving helps us be ready.

Try This!

- Save a little money each week and watch your savings grow!
- Make a mini-budget with your child: Spend, Save, Share.
- Talk about why it's important to be ready for surprises.

### Work First, Then Play – Just Like the Brick Pig

The first two pigs wanted to play right away, but the third pig worked first and then relaxed safely. That's a smart way to live!

- Help out to earn rewards: You can ask your parents if you can earn a small reward for helping—like organizing your books, watering plants, or setting the table. This teaches you that effort brings results, just like the third pig’s hard work kept him safe.
- Be proud of your effort: Even if others are having fun while you’re working, remember: your hard work will pay off, just like the brick house stood strong when the wolf came.

Try This!

- Set a small goal for your child to achieve before playtime.
- Celebrate their effort and talk about how it feels to earn their fun.
- Encourage them to be proud of their hard work.

So, what did the three little pigs really teach us? That being smart, patient, and prepared makes us strong—just like the brick house! Whether it’s saving money, doing our chores, or making good choices, we can all be like the third pig. It’s okay to take your time, work hard, and think ahead. # Prakriti Vana – A Forest Dedicated to Nature

– Yamini Kutumbale

Nature provides vital resources for human survival—air, water, food, and shelter. Yet, in pursuit of economic growth and comfort, humans have extensively damaged natural ecosystems. Forests have been cleared for agriculture, infrastructure, and urbanization, displacing countless species and degrading biodiversity. The preservation of forests and wildlife is essential for the health and balance of our planet.

The COVID-19 pandemic offered a rare glimpse into nature's ability to recover when human activity slows. During the nationwide lockdowns in 2020, cities experienced clearer skies and improved air quality. This highlighted the harmful environmental impact of pollution from vehicles, industries, and urban life—and the urgent need for more sustainable practices.

## The Idea

Prakriti Vana, or “Nature’s Forest” is a concept that envisions forest spaces reserved exclusively for flora and fauna, free from human interference. In ancient India, such forests were known as **Deva Vana**—sacred groves preserved for the divine and natural beings. The modern concept aims to restore that vision, offering safe habitats for birds, animals, and native plants.

## The Miyawaki Method

A notable technique for afforestation is the Miyawaki Method, developed by Japanese botanist Dr. Akira Miyawaki. This method uses only **native tree species**, planted densely—3 to 5 per square foot—to simulate natural forest conditions. The result is a **self-sustaining, biodiverse forest** that matures within 20–30 years.



## Prakriti Vana – A Forest Dedicated to Nature continued

Miyawaki forests support wildlife, enhance soil fertility, reduce temperatures, and absorb carbon dioxide. Though they do not replicate the full complexity of old-growth forests, they serve as effective **supplements** in degraded or urban areas.

According to a 2015 study published in *\*Nature\**, India has only **28 trees per person**, while Canada has over **8,000**. A 2017 **Greenpeace India** report estimated that **1.2 million people** in India die annually due to air pollution. Delhi remains one of the most polluted cities in the world, and none of the 168 Indian cities assessed by State Pollution Control Boards met **WHO air quality standards**. These statistics underscore the urgent need for environmental restoration through afforestation and pollution control.

### A Case Study from Madhya Pradesh

One inspiring example of a Prakriti Vana is being developed by **Shri Sarvajit Paranjape** at the **Homa Therapy Goshala** in **Maheshwar, Madhya Pradesh**. Since 2017, over **300 native trees from 25 species** have been planted. Even a 5x5 meter space has been transformed into a thriving green patch. Within two years, the area began to resemble a mature forest, demonstrating the power of community-led ecological efforts.

**Conclusion:** While Prakriti Vanas cannot replace ancient forests, they are vital tools in environmental conservation. Such initiatives must be scaled and supported across regions. Simple actions—like planting native trees or reducing pollution—can collectively contribute to a healthier and more sustainable future.

# UPSC CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION

After engineering, I was selected in the Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) and I was posted at Hazira Project at Surat in Gujarat. Thereafter I attempted the **UPSC Civil Services Examination and was selected in the year 1991.**

After two years of training I was given field posting and since then I have worked in various capacities in the Department at Jamshedpur, Kanpur, Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Allahabad, Nagpur, Dehradun, Mumbai and presently I am posted as Chief Commissioner, In-Charge of Central GST and Customs at Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh. My superannuation is on 31<sup>st</sup> July 2026. Post retirement, I intend to settle at Lucknow in Uttar Pradesh.

**Q: After settling down well as an Engineer with ONGC, it is interesting to know your enthusiasm and hard work to reach the pinnacle of success by qualifying the UPSC exams and serving our country sincerely. Kindly share the Academic qualification and the experience required for this occupation.**

For qualifying the UPSC Civil Services Examination, the requirement is simple graduation. Any graduate from any field is eligible to attend UPSC and on selection depending upon the merit he/she is allotted either All India Services (IAS, IPS, IFS) or the Central Services viz. Customs, Income Tax, Railways etc. No prior experience is required for being eligible to attend the UPSC Civil Services Examination.

**Q: It is indeed useful information to know any graduate can appear for the UPSC Civil services and get the allotment based on the merit list. What were the challenges faced by you in this profession? What were the pain areas ?**

Since bureaucracy is hierarchical, there are commonly no challenges to authority. The pain areas, if it can be called that, are the transfers which make you shift with your family from one station to another which leads to problems mainly related to the education of children. However, it is a fact that children educated at different places, get to experience diverse cultures and thus they become smarter and have a more cosmopolitan view of life.

Within service, the main challenges are human resource related, that is to keep the officers and staff under you motivated to tackle the work related challenges being faced by them. The responsibility of the higher officers is to keep the zeal and morale of the officers high all the time so that the routine work or for that matter work related problems which are faced from time to time are tackled professionally and to the satisfaction of the tax payers.

In the Central GST and the Customs Department, there is a lot of public dealing and we are duty bound to keep the tax payers satisfied. We also carry out anti-evasion activities which, though painful to the tax payers, are necessary to catch the black sheep. The functions being carried out by my Department are very important because Customs and GST collected are the main sources of the revenue for the Government of India.

**Q: It looks like your profession needs patience, perseverance, and a positive approach to your work. Above all one has to be honest and trust worthy to earn the support from the team as a whole. Tell us about the turning points, learning times and inspiring situations of your journey so far.**

I was pretty well settled as an Engineer in ONGC and had no inkling as to what UPSC examination means. While working at Surat in ONGC, I got to know about the UPSC examination from my colleagues and started preparing for the examination. **While preparing for this examination, I was forced to take a long leave from ONGC for which reason the ONGC put me on the black list. Further, the preparation for the examination is pretty costly and therefore I ended up in huge debt. Further, the success in the examination is very uncertain. So I was faced with huge odds as the continuation of my job in ONGC had become very uncertain and I had piled up a huge debt. Thus it was a make or break for me. I worked very hard, well supported by my wife knowing fully well that I had to succeed under any circumstances. My own case proves that the best of a person comes out only when he has his backs to the wall.** My hard work and the combined luck of myself and my wife turned things around for me and I was selected in the UPSC examination in the first attempt itself. It is to be noted here that among the candidates selected in UPSC, only 5% are selected in their first attempt. Due to financial troubles and other problems I could not give any further attempts.

**Q: What an inspirational journey sir. Whoever is reading this will surely get motivated to Never Give up till the goal is reached. Nothing can be achieved without family support. What were your satisfying Social practices, the extra mile in your journey.**

Throughout my career, staff welfare has been top of my agenda. I have held annual medical camps regularly in which the entire staff undergoes a full range of medical check ups. Further, fortnightly BP measuring and Blood Sugar camps are held. Further I keep on calling renowned

doctors to address my staff and officers about various ailments which keep on affecting us. Further I have concentrated on infrastructure improvement of departmental offices and colonies. In the last two and a half years, I have been running a Forum named CLSI which provides financial aid & mentoring for the education of under-privileged children. This forum is run mostly by Government employees on a voluntary basis. We select meritorious students facing financial difficulties and arrange financial aid for them. Further, our mentors guide them from time to time. As on date, we are providing aid to about 200 under privileged student beneficiaries, mostly in the state of Uttar Pradesh. The number of children is increasing day by day and in two years time it is expected that the number would increase to 500. It is very professional and run transparently. Instead of collecting the money centrally and distributing it to needy children, we get our contributors(Donors) to put the money directly into the account of the beneficiary. In this manner, the privacy & dignity of the beneficiary's family is kept intact. ## Article 17: Abolishment of untouchability

### A Heart-Touching Tale: Breaking the Chains of Untouchability"

A car driving through a scenic rural area in India. Rohan, an 11-year-old, sits excitedly in the backseat with his parents.

**Aarav:** "Wow, the village looks so beautiful, Mama! But... why are those people sitting separately near that tea stall?"

**Mama:** (looks out) "Hmm... that's something we'll talk about soon, Aarav. Let's get to the village first."

(Aarav sees a group of people being denied entry to a temple while others walk in freely. Aarav, puzzled, turns to his father.)

**Aarav:** "Papa, why can't those people go inside? Aren't they praying to the same god?"

**Papa:** (sighs) "Aarav, this is an example of discrimination. Some people believe they are superior to others based on outdated ideas."

(A quiet evening. Aarav's family sits by a bonfire in the village. Aarav, still curious, asks more questions.)

**Aarav:** "Why does this happen, Papa? Where did this idea come from?"

**Papa:** "It goes back to ancient times, Aarav. India had a system called the Varna system. It wasn't discriminatory at first. People's roles were decided based on their qualities or gunas."



# Understanding Constitution Part 8 (Article 17)

For example:"

- Brahmins (priests, scholars) shared knowledge.
- Kshatriyas (warriors) protected people.
- Vaishyas (merchants) ran businesses.
- Shudras (laborers) provided essential services.

Mama: "This shows us that no role is small or unimportant. Everyone contributes to the success of the whole."

Aarav: (smiling) "Wow! That makes so much sense, Mama. But how did it go wrong?"

Papa: "Over time, people began misinterpreting this system. Instead of valuing roles based on qualities, it became rigid, and some groups were treated unfairly."

Mama: "**Originally, 'untouchables' referred to people who lived outside the four varnas and were often involved in robbery or crime. But during British rule, they made things worse. The British labeled all Shudras—who were farmers, artisans, and workers—as 'untouchables.' Because of oppression, Shudras lost access to education and resources. Many fell into poverty, and some were forced into crime to survive. The British misused the system to divide us, turning a flexible, occupational framework into a rigid and discriminatory one.**

Papa: "This led to the downfall of our culture and economy. Discrimination became deep-rooted."

Aarav: (determined) "That's so unfair! Didn't anyone try to stop it?"

Mama: "Many great people did! Social reformers and freedom fighters like Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, Mahatma Gandhi, and others worked hard to abolish this injustice."

Papa: "When India became independent, they made sure our Constitution included Article 17, which abolished untouchability."

Mama: "Now, discrimination like this is not just wrong, it's illegal!"

### 1. APPARATUS:

- Lemon (1/2)
- Small Bowl
- Cotton swabs
- Paper
- Heat source (candle or a light bulb)

### 2. PROCEDURE:

- Gather all materials.
- Squeeze the juice of the lemon into a small bowl.
- Using the cotton swab as a pencil, write a secret message on the paper. Then, let the paper dry completely.
- Bring your heat source close to the paper and watch as your secret message magically begins to appear!

### PRINCIPLE:

Lemon juice is mostly made of a variety of sugars, acids, and water. Normally, lemon juice is mostly clear, so when you dilute it even further in water, and paint that mixture on some paper, you can't see it. However, heating up lemon juice causes some of its sugars to react with oxygen in the air (oxidation), which turns these sugars brown. Acids in the lemon juice can also react with fibers in the paper to make more sugars, which again turn brown in the heat.


